

Inactive Status-HAP

1. Any member who misses minimum number of days in two consecutive years, is released from Heavenly patrol and must reapply and start again as a trainee if an opening is available and the person is accepted into the training program.
2. A patroller may be granted one year as inactive, but this year counts as a missing year. (See #1 above)
3. The reason for going inactive is due to personal issues, including medical issues, job issues, and any other reason that precludes patrolling the minimum 14 days per season.
4. A request to go inactive must be given to the HAP and HSP patrol directors, who will determine if the inactive status will be granted.
5. Requests to go inactive must be made by December 1st of the season in question.
6. Unforeseen medical conditions or an injury after December 1st are the exception for a patroller to request Inactive status. The patroller must communicate the facts to the HAP Patrol Director and Paid Patrol Director.
7. Receiving inactive status is accompanied with elimination of season pass, family passes, and accruing bankable comps.
8. The season in which a HAP member is inactive carries no negative consequences over to the following season, such as days owed, retraining, etc.

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
